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
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#### Introduction

New Mexico Highway 264 (NM 264) is a 16-mile highway that extends west to east from the New Mexico/Arizona state line (milepost 0.0) to the US 491 interchange near Yah-Ta-Hey (milepost 16.0) in McKinley County. NM 264 connects to US 491, eight miles north of Gallup. A study evaluating the needs for the corridor was completed in 2023 and now NMDOT is working on the design plans for NM 264 between Arizona and Yah-Ta-Hey (NM 264 Roadway Improvement Projects). Ultimately, the corridor will be broken up into segments for design and construction as depicted in Figure 1.




#### **NM 264 Roadway Improvement Projects**

The purpose of the NM 264 Roadway Improvement Projects is to:


- Improve the roadway's condition and life expectancy
- Improve drainage conditions
- Address substandard roadway geometry
- Add multimodal facilities
- Implement access management
- Improve overall safety

#### Urban Section - Tse Bonito - Segment 2: Milepost (MP) 0-0.6





#### **Public Involvement Process**

NM 264 is a unique corridor, including both rural and urban segments, which provides key access for the Navajo Nation between Arizona and New Mexico. Due to this, there is a wide variety of stakeholders we must reach through these efforts, including groups such as tribal communities, commuters, emergency services, schools and school transportation, agencies, and the traveling public, among others. Ultimately, the goal of these public involvement efforts is to continue to identify these stakeholders' concerns and values to help guide the development of design plans for this corridor.

The study team, in collaboration with the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMTD) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), has developed a public involvement process throughout each phase to obtain public input containing comments, questions, concerns, and preferences on roadway improvements. A summary of those efforts for the open house is bulleted below.

- **Public Meeting #1** held virtually on August 23, 2022, via Zoom, with three participants in attendance. The meeting focused on an overview of the study area, the preliminary purpose and need, existing roadway conditions, and proposed highway improvements.
- Public Meeting #2 held virtually on Wednesday, May 17, 2023, via Zoom, with nineteen participants in attendance. The meeting reviewed the alternatives developed, and the study team's recommendations, and solicited feedback.

#### **Public Meeting #3 - Open House**

The open house for the NM 264 Roadway Improvement Projects occurred Tuesday, March 19, 2024, at the Navajo Division of Transportation from 3-7 p.m. The in-person, informal style open house included display boards of the proposed improvement designs and roll plots of Segments 2, 3, and 4 for viewing the proposed consolidation of driveways and turnouts. Segment 1 was not included as a display board or roll plot since roadway improvements are currently underway. Attendees were encouraged to ask the roadway design engineers questions regarding the segment designs. Screens and laptops were also made available to view the project areas for each segment via Google Earth.

#### **Public Meeting Notifications**

The following section contains all public meeting notifications distributed prior to the open house. Copies of the meeting notifications can be found in Appendix A, *Public Meeting Notifications*.

#### **Newspaper Advertisements**

The team developed and distributed two newspaper advertisements for this meeting. The newspaper advertisements provided an overview of the project, invited the public to attend the open house, and shared information on how to provide comments. The advertisements – which also included the date, time, and location for the meeting – were distributed in the following publications and dates:

#### **Meeting Notification Poster**

The project team distributed open house posters electronically to key stakeholders such as other agencies and tribal chapter houses, which included details on the time and location, and how to provide feedback on the projects. These stakeholders included the Navajo Nation, Navajo Nation Division of Transportation, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Navajo Nation Chapters, Gallup-McKinley County Schools, Northwest New Mexico Council of Governments, and Bureau of Land Management. The open house poster was also distributed electronically to local radio stations, including:

#### **Direct Mailer**

A direct mailer was sent to 6,970 addresses in the study area to inform residents and property owners of the open house. The mailer was distributed to all individuals on or before March 5, 2024. Mailers were sent to the following postal codes near and within the study area:

#### **Radio Advertisement**

A radio advertisement was developed in English and then translated and recorded in Dine for the local radio station, KGAK (1330 AM). The radio advertisement aired two times a day for two weeks, beginning March 5, 2024. The advertisement included the time, date, and location of the open house.

#### **Social Media**

Social media posts were developed for the NMDOT Facebook page at <a href="https://www.facebook.com/NMDOT">https://www.facebook.com/NMDOT</a>, which included the open house date, time, and location, and how to provide feedback on the projects. One post was published on Facebook the day before the open house on March 18, 2024.

#### **Banners**

Two large banners announcing the open house and comment information were posted on NM 264 in Tse Bonito and Yah-Ta-Hey.

#### **Public Meeting Materials**

#### **Display Boards and Roll Plots**

Eleven display boards were produced for the open house to welcome attendees, present the selected roadway improvement designs for the corridor and information on how to provide comments. Two display boards included the proposed access consolidation (movement of driveways/entryways) for residents and businesses within the urban sections of NM 264. Attendees also had the opportunity to view roll plots showing driveways and turnouts along Segments 2, 3, and 4 and provide additional comments or recommended improvements through sticky notes.

#### **Comment Form**

A comment form was created for the open house to collect feedback from attendees. It included space to list project concerns and additional feedback.

#### **Fact Sheet**

A fact sheet was distributed during the open house and made available on the study webpage. The fact sheet included an overview of the project, a map of the project area, the proposed improvement designs, and a project timeline.

#### **Public Comments**

In total, 27 comments were received throughout this public outreach period which focused on safety, drainage, access, lighting, and pavement. Twenty-three comments were received during the open house and four were received during the comment period.

The comments focused on various suggestions and concerns for the NM 264 corridor to improve safety while maintaining driver access within this 16-mile stretch of highway. Most comments addressed the current highway conditions as inadequate with the need for sustainable pavement construction, flood mitigation, lighting, and pedestrian safety. In addition to the highway's current issues, comments emphasized recommendations for access consolidation, roadway configuration, and signage with homage to veterans highlighting NM 264's namesake from the Navajo Code Talkers of WWII. The project team is currently evaluating the significant amount of feedback from the community to guide potential changes to proposed improvements on NM 264.

#### **Public Comments – Open House Comment Forms**

	Question/Comment
1	NM 264 is the Navajo Code Talker highway – it needs to be designated in our sidewalks, or signs, or interest points for tourists to see. Drainage – make sure there is more than 2% crown at the center – water, snow, and cinders need to drain. Fence – mesh fencing is desired to keep livestock and wildlife safe. Striping on the roadway needs to be economical and maintenance accessible for a contractor to come out in time to repaint. Budget sufficient. This NM 264 is Our main road into the largest tribal nation in the United States. Our culture, language, and tradition need to be a part of these projects. Please keep in mind future EV stations. Keep in mind our pedestrians, hitchhikers, and vendors in the area.
2	Milepost 5.5 deceleration lane needs to "safely" access my property.  Drainage across (264) at 5.5 MP. Very nice open house!
3	My recommendation to the state is that the east entrance to Speedy's should be one-way only referring to an entrance. The west should become the only exit and can also be an entrance. This way the acceleration lane would avoid people entering the highway at a slow speed which is primarily all the honking that goes on and if that acceleration lane was extended down to your driveway it could be your deceleration lane.

Milepost 1.50 - Old Coal Mine Road Intersection

- 1. Provide a turning lane (sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn north from the west roadway lanes.
- 2. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes.
- 3. Provide a turning lane (sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn north from the east roadway lanes.
- 4. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes.
- 5. Provide new street lighting at the Old Coal Mine Road Intersection.
- 6. Provide permanent signage.

#### **Segment 2: Milepost 0 to Milepost 5**

Milepost 3.10 - Veterinarian Road Intersection

- 1. Provide a turning lane (sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the east roadway lanes.
- 2. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes.
- 3. Provide a turning lane (sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the west roadway lanes.

#### **Question/Comment**

- 4. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes.
- 5. Provide new street lighting at the Veterinarian Road Intersection.
- 6. Provide permanent signage.

#### Segment 3: Milepost 5 to Milepost 10

Milepost 5.30 - Speedy's Store Intersection

- 1. Provide a turning lane (sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn north from the west roadway lanes.
- 2. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes.
- 3. Provide a turning lane (sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn north from the east roadway lanes.
- 4. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes.
- 5. Provide new street lighting at the Speedy's Store intersection.
- 6. Provide permanent signage.

#### **Segment 3: Milepost 5 to Milepost 10**

Milepost 8.50 - Defiance Draw Road (Turn off to Tsa Ya Toh Community) Intersection

- 1. Provide a turning lane (sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the east roadway lanes.
- 2. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes.
- 3. Provide a turning lane (sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the west roadway lanes.
- 4. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes.
- 5. Provide new street lighting at the Defiance Draw Road (Turn off to Tsa Ya Toh Community) Intersection.
- 6. Provide permanent signage.
- 7. Construct a new asphalt Defiance Draw Road and raise the new asphalt Defiance Draw Road elevation to the same elevation level as the New Mexico 264 Roadway at the Intersection.
- 8. Install additional new cattle guards and re-install the existing cattle guards to widen the south entrance to forty-eight (48) feet for vehicles to exit and enter the Defiance Draw Road.

#### **Question/Comment**

9. Construct a new asphalt roadway with white markings for vehicles turning east and west to enter the roadway, and for vehicles to exit and enter the Defiance Draw Road.

#### Segment 3: Milepost 5 to Milepost 10

1. It is recommended to raise the roadway elevation and to install an additional new metal culvert. Provide flooding mitigation at milepost 9.5 to milepost 10.

#### **Other General comments:**

- 1. Provide flooding mitigation at milepost 3.4 to milepost 3.6.
- 2. Provide flooding mitigation at milepost 8.9.
- 3. Provide flooding mitigation at milepost 14.90 to milepost 15.10.
- 4. Repair and install new light bulbs for the existing six (6) tallest street light poles at the milepost 16 Interchange.
- 5. It is recommended to inspect and develop future maintenance improvement projects or the New Mexico 264 road from milepost O to milepost 16.
- Traffic too fast in the morning people getting work. Tse Bonito wash part blocks off fence. Access all ok.
- The overall redesign of the roadway. The road is going to be narrow than the existing and certain medians are going to be removed and replaced with rumble strip unless there's a study that shows a rumble strip is safer than the raised median. Are we narrowing the roadway due to cost and compromising on safety? Typically, when a road is reconstructed, there are added safety features. This project seems to decrease safety by eliminating and/or reducing the median or shoulder.
- We need a streetlight at the corner of Route 54. Also, we need reflectors. Also, all the people that use the road need to pay 10 cents or something.
- 8 Merging on the West and East bound traffic needs pavement. 264 and N54.


# Project Area Map




### Proposed Typicals Section – Segment 2 (MP 0-0.6) – Urban






# Proposed Typicals Section – Segment 2 (0.6-5) – Rural








#### NM 264 ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

#### **OVERVIEW**

New Mexico Highway 264 (NM 264) is a 16-mile highway that extends west to east from the New Mexico/Arizona state line (milepost 0.0) to the US 491 interchange near Yah-Ta-Hey (milepost 16.0) in McKinley County. NM 264 connects to US 491, eight miles north of Gallup. A study evaluating the needs for the corridor was completed in 2023 and now the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) is working on the designs for NM 264 between Arizona and Yah-Ta-Hey. Ultimately, the corridor will be broken up into segments for design and construction.





- Replaces damaged pavement





My recommendation to the state is that the east entrance to Speedy's should be one way only referring to an entrance. The west should become the only exit and can also be an entrance. #### Comments and concerns provided for incorporation to the New Mexico Roadway Improvement Projects:

#### Segment 1: Milepost 10 to Milepost 14

#### Mile post 13.20 - Rock Springs Road Intersection

- Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the east roadway lanes.
- 2. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes.
- Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the west roadway lanes.
- 4. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes
- 5. Provide new street lighting at the Rock Springs Road Intersection.
- 6. Provide permanent signage.
- Install additional new cattle guards to widen the south entrance to forty-eight (48) feet for vehicles to exit and enter the Rock Springs Road.
- Construct a new asphalt roadway with white markings for vehicles turning east and west to enter the roadway, and for vehicles to exit and enter the Rock Springs Road.

#### Segment 2: Milepost 0 to Milepost 5

#### Mile post 1.50 - Old Coal Mine Road Intersection

- 1 Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn north from the west roadway lanes.
- Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes.
- 3. Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn north from the east roadway lanes.
- 4. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes
- Provide new street lighting at the Old Coal Mine Road Intersection.
- Provide permanent signage.

#### Segment 2: Milepost 0 to Milepost 5

#### Mile post 3.10 - Veterinarian Road Intersection

- Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the east roadway lanes.
- 2. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes.
- Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the west roadway lanes.
- 4. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes

- 5. Provide new street lighting at the Veterinarian Road Intersection.
- 6. Provide permanent signage.

#### Segment 3: Milepost 5 to Milepost 10

#### Mile post 5.30 - Speedy's Store Intersection

- Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn north from the west roadway lanes.
- 2 Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes.
- 3 Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn north from the east roadway lanes.
- 4 Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes
- 5 Provide new street lighting at the Speedy's Store Intersection.
- 6 Provide permanent signage.

#### Segment 3: Milepost 5 to Milepost 10

#### Mile post 8.50 - Defiance Draw Road (Turn off to Tsa Ya Toh Community) Intersection

- Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the east roadway lanes.
- 2. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the east roadway lanes.
- Provide a turning lane (Sufficient distance) for vehicles to turn south from the west roadway lanes.
- 4. Provide an acceleration lane for vehicles to enter the west roadway lanes
- Provide new street lighting at the Defiance Draw Road (Turn off to Tsa Ya Toh Community) Intersection.
- Provide permanent signage.
- Construct a new asphalt Defiance Draw Road and raise the new asphalt Defiance Draw Road elevation to the same elevation level as the New Mexico 264 Roadway at the Intersection
- Install additional new cattle guards and re-install the existing cattle guards to widen the south entrance to forty-eight (48) feet for vehicles to exit and enter the Defiance Draw Road.
- Construct a new asphalt roadway with white markings for vehicles turning east and west to enter the roadway, and for vehicles to exit and enter the Defiance Draw Road.

#### Segment 3: Milepost 5 to Milepost 10

 It is recommended to raise the roadway elevation and to install additional new metal culvert. Provide flooding mitigation at milepost 9.5 to milepost 10.

#### Other General comments:

- 1. Provide flooding mitigation at milepost 3.4 to milepost 3.6.
- 2. Provide flooding mitigation at milepost 8.9
- 3. Provide flooding mitigation at milepost 14.90 to milepost 15.10
- Repair and install new light bulbs for the existing six (6) tallest street light poles at the milepost 16 Interchange.
- 5. It is recommended to inspect and develop future maintenance improvement projects or the New Mexico 264 road from milepost 0 to milepost 16.
